2 Read and discuss Green Eggs and Ham by Dr Seuss Pay special attention to the rhyming words 3 Have students reread specific passages from the story Ask groups of students to "round up" and record the rhyming words Sort them according to their word families 4 Collect and display the rhyming words in a graphic organizer
