Today Maria Montessori (1870 - 1952) is considered one of the pioneers of early childhood pedagogy Having qualified as a medical doctor she started her professional life working with young children, many of whom had learning difficulties and were living in an asylum

Montessori defines the school as "a prepared environment in which the child, set free from undue adult intervention, can live its life according to the law of development" The Montessori method emphasizes that practical sensory, practical life and formal skills be included in the prepared learning environment of an effective classroom
