### Pragmatic Aspects of Meaning II: Speech Acts ...

perform SPEECH ACTS • Austin (1962) says that when a speaker utters a sentence, s/he may perform three types of acts: locutionary act,

illocutionary act and perlocutionary act • Locutionary act: an act of uttering a sentence with a certain sense and reference, which is roughly equivalent to 'meaning' in the traditional sense
