**C. S. LEWIS' THE PROBLEM OF PAIN (1940)**

ONE ATHEIST'S POINT OF VIEW (C S LEWIS, PRIOR TO FAITH) • immense universe; tiny, suffering humans (1-2) • pain (physical or psychological) & death as the foundational problems of human existence Pain the only real evil (1-2) • if God exists and allows suffering, God must be grotesque: powerless, indifferent, or sadistic (3)
